

# Trinity Sunday-26 May 2024 Thought for the Week

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, affirming our belief in one God living through three divine persons. To understand the Trinity is to understand the revelation of God to us, in the form of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It offers us a relational model of community, sharing, belonging and mutual love in our relationships.

Many of us say we believe in the Trinity, but do we really? Regularly we pray, 'Glory be to the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.' Can we even imagine it? All of our metaphors are simply words trying to grasp the reality of God that can only be experienced. The medieval mystic Julian of Norwich experienced the Trinity in her multiple visions ('showings') of God during a near-death illness.

This model of communion and equality of three-in-one can also be a challenge because our culture values individualism over community; champions 'my' rights over the common good. Too often the focus is on separation, boundaries, building walls instead of bridges. Walls separate, bridges unite.

When we say the Trinity is 'mystery' we're using the term in the sense that it is inexhaustible, so profound, so rich and deep that it can never be explained fully, but only experienced with our hearts.

Many of you will be familiar with the beautiful icon of the Trinity by Andrei Rublev, depicting the visit of three 'angels' to Abraham (Gen.18:1-33). Abraham sees them not as ordinary folk but as God visiting him – the three form a bridge into the oneness of God. This icon is seen as a mirror of the Trinity.

When we enter into the mystery of the Trinity, we can no longer exclude other people. All are loved equally and all are valued by God. As a community of love, we are invited to be part of it, to share in it and to experience God's unconditional love for the whole of humanity, and for all God's creation.
